To promote the Novena to the parish, the Council utilized word of mouth, announcements at Council business and planning meetings, Parish bulletin advertisements, and posts on both the Council and Parish Facebook page (see attached photos).

The Council ran several programs concurrently to promote a culture of life. At the center was a 9-Day Rosary Vigil Novena, held September 18 – September 26. Due to COVID restrictions, the Novena prayers were either live-streamed, or in-person at the St. Mary of the Mills memorial to the unborn in the church cemetery (when permissible). The site needed renovation and re-landscaping following a harsh, hot summer (photos attached).

The Council also participated in the Cemetery of Innocents program. Volunteers built the memorial at St. Mary's Church, and maintained it for two weeks. The memorial was composed of 56 Red, White, and Blue Crosses (representing the USA and its territories; see attached photos).

During this period, the Council also hosted the Silver Rose Icon from October 4–6. The icon was displayed at St. Mary's Church following the Sunday Masses. We then held a live-streamed, bilingual prayer service.

Life Director Mike Turek continued to host a weekly bilingual, virtual/live-streamed Rosary for the Unborn through October 2020.
