On May 31st, the Church will celebrate the Feast of the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. If you recall, when Gabriel invites Mary to be the Mother of the Messiah, the archangel also shares with her that her cousin Elizabeth is with child, that child being John the Baptist. The Gospel tells us that Mary went in haste to be with her cousin, and we can only imagine the conversations and spiritual sharing that took place between these two holy women.

Several months ago when I was at a parish to celebrate Sunday Mass I saw a pile of cards with a scene of the Visitation on the table near the entrance. It was a card published by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and has a "Prayer for Radical Solidarity" in protecting the dignity of every person addressed to Mary on the reverse. One line of the prayer really caught my attention: "In that first Eucharistic procession, you carried Jesus to Elizabeth in her time of need." Luke's Gospel tells us that when Mary, carrying the Christ Child arrived, "she entered Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leapt in her womb." (Lk 1:40-41)

During the month of May preparations will be underway for the Mother Seton route of the National Eucharistic Processions to pass through Maryland. I am sure many will make an effort to participate in a portion of the procession or at one of the stops along the way. Wouldn't it be wonderful if every time that we meet Jesus in the Eucharist our hearts, our beings, would leap for joy, for our Savior is so near? Creating such longing, and enlivening our faith, is surely an important part of this National Eucharistic Revival. During this month of May let us ask Mary to help us be renewed in faith and devotion each time we welcome her Son into our midst.

Our Worthy Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly is again challenging you and your council to 'Pass the Hat' to support pregnancy resource centers (PRCs) and maternity homes (MHs). Specifically, you're challenged to raise funds between today and May 31st with special emphasis on collections during our State Convention! Our Ultrasound Fund does a great job of showing mothers that their unborn child is, in fact, their living son or daughter. This is a life-changing moment for even the most skeptical mother and your continued fundraising for ultrasound machines is essential.

Faced with the realization that Mom is carrying her son/daughter, many mothers feel overwhelmed by their calling to carry, birth and raise this new life in their womb. The ASAP program is intended to encourage and support these mothers beyond the ultrasound machines. Supreme's ASAP program provides financial and non-financial support to PRCs and Mothers' Homes. The goal of this drive is to build upon last year's initial ASAP initiative.

Every council is encouraged to pass the hat at your April and May meetings. Councils are also encouraged to donate from their general or charity funds. Additionally, we'll pass the hat during the convention in May.

- Supreme will provide 25% matching funds up to \$12,500 for \$50,000 raised.
- Councils may designate a specific PCC/MH. Undesignated funds will be distributed among the ~40 centers in Maryland.
- Council donations can be listed as ASAP participation as a life program activity on their SP7 awards input form.
- Councils cannot submit an ASAP grant application for their "pass the hat" contributions because it would duplicate the state-level reporting of these funds.
- **All funds must be turned into the Maryland State Council ASAP but no later than May 31st.**
