# State Chaplain's Message

I was recently invited to offer the School Mass at St. Stephen's Parish in Bradshaw, MD. The Gospel for that day (Mark 9:30-37) spoke of Jesus and the Apostles on a journey. I suggested to the students that Jesus has also been with them on the journey of this school year, and that we should invite Jesus along on the journey of life. I can only imagine that on journeys such as the one recounted in that Gospel passage, as they walked along or took a break, that not only did Jesus offer teaching, but he engaged in the normal exchange of conversation. Elsewhere in the Gospel Jesus would say "I call you friends." (John 15:15). That is a powerful term, for friends offer support when they are physically present, when we connect by some other means, or simply by knowing there is a friend there to whom we can reach out.

The unique national Eucharistic processions which launched on Pentecost have Jesus, present in the Eucharist, journeying through large parts of America. Countless individuals will join in short periods of the processions, or in the various Masses and services along these routes. They will conclude at the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July. Many will have an opportunity to participate here in Maryland and the District of Columbia. I hope others will be intrigued by reports of these processions, as curiosity and questions often lead people to a deeper interior search. I'm sure we all hope and pray that Catholics in our country will re-ignite their belief in the Eucharist, and we will see Mass attendance grow in numbers and participation.

Beyond these special pilgrimage moments, we might each consider how we personally invite Jesus to journey with us. Time in the car, or waiting for an appointment, or a leisurely walk are but a few occasions where we can pray, reflect, or dialogue with the Lord. (Remember when we would steer clear of people apparently talking to themselves? Today, we presume they are on their phone, so we can even talk to Jesus out loud!) How much richer the journey of life can be when we invite Jesus along.

## June 2024



This month of June in 2024 is a very busy month for us in the Knights of Columbus. With five Sundays in the month, we have the opportunity to invite Catholic Gentlemen into the Order on a bonus weekend.

The National Eucharistic Procession is passing through Maryland this month. The Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Route started at St. Mary's in New Haven, Connecticut, the birthplace of the Knights of Columbus. The first stop on the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route is at St. John's in Westminster in the evening of June 5. Additional stops at the Seton Shrine in Emmitsburg, Cathedral of Our Queen in Baltimore and the Basilica of the Assumption also in Baltimore. On June 6&7. In the Southern part of Maryland, we can join the Eucharistic Procession at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and St. John Paul II National Shrine in Washington DC on June 8. These are great opportunities to meet with the men of your Parish, participate in the Eucharistic Procession, and invite them to become Knights of Columbus. Give the invitation.

Father's Day is also in June. How better to honor our Catholic fathers than by inviting them to become a Knight of Columbus. 



In January of 2022, a strong snowstorm toppled trees and covered the outdoor statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Holy Family church in Mitchellville, MD. Father Joe Jenkins, jokingly suggested it might be the perfect time to put a roof over Mary's head.
