State Chaplain's Message

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For the first half of April we will continue our observance of Lent, with the goal to be better prepared for Easter. As Palm Sunday and Holy Week unfold, we are urged to intensify those preparations, for the great day of Easter is drawing near. Then, at least liturgically, the Church pulls out all the stops to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.

St. Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians, chapter 15, speaks about the resurrection, and Jesus' appearances after He rose. Paul is responding because some were already denying the actual resurrection, and giving it a symbolic meaning (which perhaps has never completely disappeared). Paul even writes (verse 14), "And if Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, your faith." He relates the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus to imply

"if you don't believe me, ask one of these people."

There is no question that the resurrection of Jesus is central to Christian belief, and indeed, makes (or should make) all the difference in our lives. From earliest times people had pondered the mystery of death, and many came to the conclusion that there is a life after death. But the resurrection of Jesus is not only affirming that there is life after death, but "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." (Nicene Creed) When we know what is promised us after earthly death, we can live our lives with a hope and joy that might not otherwise be possible.

For eight days the Church will celebrate the Octave of Easter, and then continue the Easter Season, through to the Ascension of Jesus into heaven, and then on to Pentecost (this year on June 8th). Further, the Christian Sabbath is on Sunday, as that was the day of resurrection, and the Church reminds that every Sunday Eucharist is to be a "little Easter." With the arrival of spring, and the promises of our faith, we are invited to a new embrace of both life and discipleship. May the Knights and Ladies continue to be people of faith, of hope, and of charity for Jesus is risen from the dead. Alleluia!

Remember to submit your Faith in Action Program Form 10784 after your council programs. As a reminder, programs conducted from April 1st through June 30th fulfil your 4th quarter requirement for Supreme reporting and count towards your 1st period program requirements for the Maryland State Council. Be sure to forward copies of your 10784 to reports@kofc-md.org and your District Deputy. Also, please complete and submit your Columbian Award Form SP-7 to Supreme (with a copy to reports@kofc-md.org and your DD) as soon as possible. Please, don't wait until June 30th to submit the report. If you submit the report early and Supreme sends it back to you, then you will have time to revise the form and resubmit it. Remember, Form SP-7 is a requirement for Star Council.

A special thanks to Walt Williams and Brian Trott, State Sports Co-Chairs for planning, coordinating, and running a successful State Basketball Free Throw Competition on March 22nd at St. Vincent Pallotti High School in Laurel. There were well over one hundred participants and family members from across the state in attendance. Food for Families Program



"Making a Difference in Someone's Life" is the focus of the Maryland State Council. An important part of this initiative is providing food for needy families.

Dozens of councils and assemblies across the State are involved in the collection and distribution of food. Here is a reminder of a side benefit for these efforts. There are two ways provided for your council or assembly to make a difference.

The first is to make a \$500 donation to the food bank of your choice, the second is a donation of 1000 pounds of food to a single organization. Either qualifies your council or assembly for a \$100 rebate from Supreme.

It is very important that the proper forms be completed correctly and submitted on time. The deadline is June 30, 2025, for each submittal. No more than 5 refunds can be earned during any one year.

One additional requirement is that a council or assembly devote at least 100-man hours towards each activity.

ASAP Program Update

Thank you to all the councils and members that contributed to the Maryland State Council initiative to build a live-in addition to the Gabriel Network Maternity Home in Bowie. We reached the State goal and received the ASAP Matching funds from Supreme. The video in this link is Tiffany Farley, Gabriel Network Executive Director, walking through the addition: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KcMLGslLsU>.

The video also shows the condition of the existing house, and work needed to make it suitable for women to move back in. Work has begun on this renovation, but they are approximately \$9k short of the goal to complete the work. If you would like to assist in Phase 2 of this project, please send your ASAP contribution directly to “Gabriel Network”, 2137 Defense Hwy, Crofton, MD 21114 with the note that it is for the “Phase 2 home renovation”. If including a cover letter, please also specifically state that it is for the renovation of the original maternity home.

Other pregnancy and maternity centers still need our assistance, and the ASAP Program provides a grant from Supreme of \$100 for every \$500 donated in cash or goods, up to \$2000 per council per center. A council can donate to multiple centers and the Supreme grant applies to each center donated. For example, if a council donates \$2000 each to three pregnancy centers, Supreme will provide a \$400 grant to each of the three pregnancy centers.

The ASAP Grants from Supreme work on the Columbian Year. We have until 30 June to make the donation and submit the grant application. 1 July, everything is reset and our councils can contribute to the same centers and apply for the grant.

The Grant application is online. The form is self-explanatory. You will need the EIN number for the organization (Contact me if you need assistance with this). Needed supporting documentation is either a copy of the cancelled check, or a signed ASAP Donation Receipt Letter (11418 Aid and Support Donation Receipt). If the center is listed on the map on the Supreme ASAP website (ASAP (Aid and Support After Pregnancy) | The Knights of Columbus), no W-9 is needed. If it is not listed, you will need to obtain a W-9 from the center.

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¡Hola Hermanos Caballeros! Ruego que ustedes y sus familias estén bien.

“Hagamos una diferencia en la vida de alguien”

Continuamos con la historia de Caballeros de Colón desde su fundación hasta el día de hoy, (vea el boletín de Julio 2024 donde empezamos esta historia).

1979-1999 una familia cristiana

Los Caballeros de Colón promovieron varias iniciativas en materia de educación católica: apoyo a las escuelas católicas, fondos de becas para seminarios y universidades católicas, y la creación de un campus en América del Norte del Pontificio Instituto Juan Pablo II para Estudios sobre el Matrimonio y la Familia.

Además de celebrar el quinto centenario de la evangelización del Nuevo Mundo, la Orden también honró los modelos contemporáneos de santidad. El Caballero Supremo Dechant entregó a la Madre Teresa el premio inaugural Gaudium et Spes en 1992, y la Arquidiócesis de Hartford abrió oficialmente la causa de canonización del Padre McGivney, con el apoyo de los Caballeros, en 1997.

1979: En cooperación con los obispos de EE. UU., la Orden asegura la filmación de la primera visita pastoral del Papa Juan Pablo II a EE. UU.

1979: Los Caballeros crean el Fondo Padre Michael J. McGivney de un millón de dólares para Nuevas Iniciativas en la Educación Católica que será administrado por la National Catholic Educational Association. Las ganancias anuales se usan hasta hoy para financiar programas que promueven las escuelas católicas.

1981: La Orden comienza una restauración de cuatro años de la Iglesia de Santa María, el lugar de nacimiento de los Caballeros. Las renovaciones incluyen trabajos en el órgano, el piso, los bancos, los techos, las estatuas, entre otras cosas. El proyecto se culmina con la colocación de un campanario de 55 metros en la parte superior de la iglesia.

1982 (imagen izquierda): Los Caballeros de Colón celebran su centenario. El Presidente Ronald Reagan asiste a la 100ª Convención Suprema, así como el Cardenal Agostino Casaroli, enviado por el Papa Juan Pablo II como su enviado personal.

1982: La Orden crea varios fondos para ayudar a financiar estudios para sacerdotes y seminaristas en Roma en colegios pontificios. Estos fondos se han incrementado a lo largo de los años para apoyar a los seminaristas y sacerdotes de los Estados Unidos, Canadá, México y Filipinas.

1984: En reconocimiento al servicio voluntario de la Orden, el Presidente Ronald Reagan otorga a los Caballeros el Premio de Acción Voluntaria del Presidente en una ceremonia en la Casa Blanca.

1985: La Orden acuerda financiar la restauración de la fachada de 6000 metros cuadrados de la Basílica de San Pedro, la primera vez que se restaura en más de 350 años. Varios proyectos posteriores se han llevado a cabo en San Pedro, incluyendo la restauración de las capillas y de la Puerta del Año Santo.

1988: La Madre Teresa visita la oficina del Consejo Supremo. La Orden acepta imprimir copias de las Constituciones de las Misioneras de la Caridad, tarjetas de oración y otros artículos religiosos, un proyecto que continúa en la actualidad.

1988: El Pontificio Instituto Juan Pablo II para Estudios sobre el Matrimonio y la Familia abre una sucursal norteamericana en Washington, D.C., con fondos de los Caballeros. Carl A. Anderson es el primer vicerrector y decano del instituto.

1989: Se crea el Fondo del Bicentenario de la Jerarquía de EE. UU. por un monto de 2 millones de dólares a beneficio de la Universidad Católica de América. Las ganancias del fondo pagan los proyectos de la universidad cada año.

1992: La Madre Teresa recibe el primer premio Gaudium et Spes de la Orden en la 110ª Convención Suprema de Nueva York. El premio “Joy and Hope” reconoce sus contribuciones a la Iglesia y al mundo.

1995: La Orden copatrocina con la Diócesis de Brooklyn, N.Y., la misa del Papa Juan Pablo II en el Aqueduct Racetrack durante la visita pastoral del Papa a los Estados Unidos.
