# State Chaplain's Message

At Sunday Mass we generally recite the Nicene Creed after the homily and before the intercessions, but on Easter Sunday we say "I do (believe)" to the various parts of the creed as we renew our baptismal promises. In either format, it's possible to go through the Creed without much thought as to what we are saying; that can be the downside of something we recite so often.

This year is the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea (now a city in Turkey), which met from May to July in the year 325. Keep in mind that the Church had just been recognized in the Roman Empire, could publicly function and worship, and so it was the perfect time to make sure there was unity in what was being taught. That was also a goal of Constantine, who had become the sole emperor, and he wanted peace among all members of the empire. This is generally considered the first of the ecumenical councils, with about 300 bishops participating.

A main topic was a discussion on the divine nature of Christ, and the relationship between God the Father and God the Son. The divine nature was disputed by the priest Arius, and his teaching was condemned as heretical. It is from there that we have come to profess that Jesus is "consubstantial with the Father." This council also agreed on a uniform observance of the date for Easter, and had the first codification of Church (canon) laws.

I believe an anniversary like this can help us appreciate how the Church reached its explanations of critical teachings, and reminds that the Pope, along with the bishops of the Church, form the "magisterium," the teaching body of the Church. All these centuries later we are still using one of the products of that Council.

This might also be a good month to take one's time slowly going through the Nicene Creed, reflecting on each of the statements, and perhaps looking for a fuller explanation of any part that is less than clear. A helpful resource for such questions is always the "Catechism of the Catholic Church" published in 1994. For anyone trying to better understand what the Church teaches on a particular topic it is a great resource.

Finally, as the State Convention is held early this month, let's offer a prayer for all who fill a leadership role here in Maryland at the council, district and state levels. May they help all the Knights and Ladies be a force for good here in our state.

## **Statement From Knights of Columbus Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly on the Death of His Holiness Pope Francis**

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — Knights of Columbus Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly issued the following statement today on the death of His Holiness Pope Francis:

"The more than 2.1 million Knights of Columbus around the world join Catholics and people of all faiths today as we mourn the death of our Holy Father Pope Francis, the Bishop of Rome and spiritual leader of the Catholic Church. Pope Francis was a powerful witness to charity and fraternity, calling us from his first days as pope to reach out to the margins of society and serve those who are too often forgotten.

"The Knights of Columbus is particularly grateful for its close relationship with our late Holy Father. Pope Francis continually encouraged our charitable mission and offered his blessing for our work, especially our humanitarian efforts around the world. Pope Francis was also very supportive of our efforts to help Catholic men be better husbands and fathers and take up co-responsibility for the Church's mission of evangelization.

"Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him."

## **Statement From Knights of Columbus Supreme Chaplain Archbishop Lori on the Death of His Holiness Pope Francis**

*"I learned this morning with great sadness of the death of Pope Francis. Just yesterday, he greeted the crowds in Rome, as if to say farewell to the People of God whom he loved so dearly and served so devotedly. May his great soul rest in peace.*

*Throughout the years of his pontificate, Pope Francis manifested his love for the poor and marginalized. He lifted up the plight of migrants and refugees, victims of injustice, the sick and elderly, and global poverty. He elevated the voice of the Church in places considered "remote" in major population centers. He called for the protection of the environment as God's gift and as*

humanity's common home. In that context, he wrote on the "integral ecology" of the human person, an insightful defense of human dignity. In an age of polarization, he called for a more fraternal society and "a new kind of politics". Pope Francis also made "synodality" a hallmark of his papacy, urging the Church to listen with understanding and compassion to the voice of its people, including those who often feel excluded.

Pope Francis challenged dioceses, parishes, and other church communities to undergo what he called "a missionary conversion" – to be centers of missionary activity intent on fulfilling the Lord's mandate to spread the Gospel. I have attempted to capture for our local church of Baltimore the spirit and content of his exhortations in three pastoral letters all with the title "A Light Brightly Visible".

His devotional writings, such as his recent letter on the Sacred Heart, are beautiful and inspiring. His designation of 2025 as a Jubilee of Hope, a special Holy Year focused on the hope that is ours in Christ Jesus, was a much needed tonic for Church and world.

I was privileged to visit with Pope Francis on various occasions, often accompanying the Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus to his private audiences with the Pope, in my capacity as Vice-President of the Conference of Catholic Bishops, and during the Synod of Bishops last October. On one occasion, seminarians from the Archdiocese of Baltimore presented Pope Francis, an avid sports fan, with a Ravens jersey.

Pope Francis goes home to God just as the Church celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, his victory over sin and death. In the coming days, I shall offer a Mass for the Holy Father and it is my plan to attend his funeral. Often the Holy Father would ask visitors to pray for him. I am sure he would want us to pray for him now that he may rest in the peace of the Risen Lord."

## Faith In Action – Make A Difference in Someone’s Life

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! I pray that you and your family are having a blessed Easter Season. The Easter season is a terrific opportunity for you and your councils to conduct meaningful Faith in Action Programs that make a difference in someone’s life. Here are some FIA Program ideas for May and June:

- Mother’s Day is May 11th. Distribute marigolds or flowers to the mothers and ladies in your council and parish.
- May is the month of Our Lady. Host regularly scheduled rosaries for your council and parish. For more information, visit [kofc.org/rosary](http://kofc.org/rosary).
- Pass the Hat for Aid and Support After Pregnancy. Collect donations to support a pregnancy center in your community. Pray for life and for all mothers and their babies. As of March, the Maryland jurisdiction ranks ninth in the amount of council donations with \$104,395 donated. Thank you!
- Meet with your Pastor and plan a Eucharistic procession for the Feast of Corpus Christi. For information and planning resources, visit <https://www.kofc.org/en/who-we-are/our-faith/eucharist.html>.
- June is the month of the Sacred Heart. Host the Sacred Heart of Jesus Pilgrim Icon for your parish. If your council isn’t scheduled to have the Icon, you can still plan a Sacred Heart Holy Hour (without the Pilgrim Icon). The Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is June 27th. Remember to submit your Faith in Action Program Form 10784 after every program. Be sure to forward copies of your 10784 to [reports@kofc-md.org](mailto:reports@kofc-md.org) and to your District Deputy.

The deadline for councils to submit the Columbian Award Application (SP-7) to Supreme is rapidly approaching - due June 30th. Please, don’t wait until June 30th to submit the report. If you submit the report early and Supreme sends it back to you due to an error, you will have time to revise and resubmit the form by June 30th. The Columbian Award Application is a requirement for Star Council.

Bring your family and friends to the Maryland State Council family picnic on Saturday, May 17 at Seneca Creek State Park. Invite a friend from work or your parish who is considering joining the Order. This is a wonderful opportunity to show that we are a faith-filled and family-centered organization. Plus, we will have plenty of food and drinks. ¡Hola Hermanos Caballeros! Ruego que ustedes y sus familias estén bien.

“Hagamos una diferencia en la vida de alguien”

Continuamos con la historia de Caballeros de Colón desde su fundación hasta el día de hoy, (vea el bulletin de Julio 2024 donde empezamos esta historia).

## 2000-2005 EL NUEVO MILENIO

El 21 de mayo de 2000, el Papa Juan Pablo II canonizó a 25 mártires de México, incluyendo a seis miembros de los Caballeros de Colón. Menos de un año después, Carl A. Anderson fue instalado como el 13º Caballero Supremo en la Ciudad de México y dedicó la Orden y su administración a María con el título de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe.

Después de los ataques terroristas del 11 de septiembre de 2001, la Orden entregó ayuda inmediata a las familias de los primeros socorristas fallecidos. Cuando ocurrieron desastres naturales, como el huracán Katrina en 2005, los Caballeros también respondieron con ayuda inmediata.

Por último, al igual que respondieron a las fuerzas del secularismo y los prejuicios en el pasado, los Caballeros han apoyado a sus obispos y han sido testigos de la importancia de la religión y la libertad religiosa para la sociedad. A medida que la causa de canonización del Venerable Michael McGivney avanza, también lo hacen sus Caballeros, buscando construir una civilización de amor.

2000 (imagen izquierda): El Papa Juan Pablo II canoniza a seis sacerdotes mexicanos miembros de los Caballeros de Colón que fueron martirizados durante la persecución de la Iglesia a principios del siglo XX. Al año siguiente, Juan Pablo II beatifica al Beato Carlos Rodríguez, un laico de Puerto Rico y miembro. Otros tres miembros de México han sido beatificados desde entonces, y uno ha sido canonizado.

2001: El Museo de los Caballeros de Colón abre en New Haven. Además de una exposición permanente sobre la historia de la Orden, el museo ha presentado numerosas exposiciones temporales y obras de arte de valor incalculable, como el modelo de estudio de madera de 5 metros de Miguel Ángel para la cúpula de la Basílica de San Pedro.

2001: En respuesta a los ataques terroristas del 11 de septiembre de 2001, el 12 de septiembre los Caballeros crean su Fondo de Héroes de 1 millón de dólares. Se entregan cheques de 3000 dólares a las familias de todos los profesionales a tiempo completo de las fuerzas del orden, bomberos y personal médico de emergencia que perdieron la vida en el World Trade Center y el Pentágono. Cuarenta y cinco Caballeros fueron asesinados el 11 de septiembre.

2003: 100,000 ejemplares de un libro de oraciones de bolsillo, Armed With the Faith (Armados de Fe), son impresos por la Orden y la Arquidiócesis para los Servicios Militares de EE. UU., y enviados a las tropas en Irak y Afganistán, junto con 10,000 rosarios.
