June is traditionally the month of the Sacred Heart in the Church, and thus a wonderful month to have a service incorporating the Sacred Heart Icon if it is in (or near) your District. In 2024 the Order announced that this icon program would commence, noting the 350th anniversary of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque's visions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which began around 1674. The icon being used reproduces a painting of the Sacred Heart by Italian artist Pompeo Batoni, which can be found in Rome's Church of the Gesu. I am going to quote two paragraphs from an article entitled "Devoted to the Heart of Jesus" by Cecilia Engbert which can be found on the Order website (www.kofc.org).

"Our Lord reminded [St. Margaret Mary] of that ancient and beautiful devotion, and she shared that gift with the world," said Supreme Knight Kelly during the Supreme Convention's annual States Dinner on Aug. 6. "In the heart of Christ, we see the heart of the Father, and we ask Our Lord to help us make his heart our own, so that we may see and love in others what he sees and loves in us. That is what the world needs. And on the 350th anniversary of St. Margaret Mary's visions, we will make this mission our own."

"The Order's founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, had a deep devotion to the Sacred Heart, fostered in him from childhood: The McGivney family had in their home an ornate devotional plaque of the Sacred Heart that is still in the Order's possession. In 1881, when Father McGivney accompanied convicted murderer Chip Smith to the gallows, Smith wore a Sacred Heart badge given to him by the priest. A century later, when Father McGivney's body was exhumed in 1981, it was discovered that he had been buried with a cloth image of the Sacred Heart."

With this in mind, I was struck by the fact that Pope Leo XIV's coat of arms also has a heart, as is found on the coat of arms of the Augustinian Order. In this case, it is to remind of the words of St. Augustine from his Confessions, "you (Christ) wounded my heart with your love," and "our heart is restless until it rests in you." It is also meant to signify that the Word of God transforms the hearts of those who read or listen to God's Word, and ponder the meaning of the message.

May we open our hearts to the power of God's Word and love this month, and throughout the time the Sacred Heart icon travels around the state. May any time we see Pope Leo's coat of arms be a reminder that we, too, need to open our hearts to the power of God.

Important Reminders for Fraternal Leaders

District Deputy

- Ensure councils hold their election of officers by June 15 and submit the [Report of Officers Chosen for the Term](#) (#185) and [Service Program Personnel Report](#) (#365) by June 30. Submitting these forms [via Member Management](#) is the best way to ensure officers and directors receive timely [access to Officers Online](#) and critical communications from the Supreme Council.
- Please remind councils that the EFF Director position needs to be submitted via a separate form [Council EFF Director Submission Form](#) (online submission only).
- Plan to attend your jurisdiction organizational meeting and then schedule your district meeting shortly thereafter using our recommended [agenda](#) and [notes](#) as a guide.
- Review the [Program Forms Reference Guide](#) with your councils. Encourage councils to submit all forms and applications early and via online submission.

Grand Knight

- Continue to submit the [Fraternal Programs Report Form](#) (#10784) for program activity upon completion of every event. This report gives us important real time data on council activities. Your inputs are used in ongoing evaluation and improvements to our Faith in Action programs.
- Schedule a transition meeting with outgoing and incoming officers and directors.
- Complete the [Fraternal Benefits Event Council Report](#) (#11077) as soon as possible after participating in an approved seminar. For awards consideration these forms must be received by June 30.
- **Q3 Cor Data Needed:** If you haven't already, please submit your Q3 Cor Report [Cor - Quarterly Report - FY 24-25](#). This survey is essential for understanding the impact of Cor across the Order.
- **FY 25/26 Council EFF Director Submission Form now available.** As soon as you or your successor know your EFF Director for the next fraternal year, please fill out this quick form to ensure he receives all Cor communications.



We often hear that numbers don't always tell the full story. But when it comes to discussing membership growth, they certainly can tell us plenty! In fact, allow me to share some numbers that illustrate what you and Maryland Knights have accomplished during this fraternal year to help grow the Order; it's pretty amazing!

As of this writing on Memorial Day weekend...

-We have welcomed 978 Catholic men into the Order. That means that 978 men are now available to work alongside us as brother Knights in our efforts to serve those in our parishes and communities. Equally important, these men also have the unique opportunity to grow in their faith among a community of Catholic men who can inspire and support them on that journey.

-Almost 3 out of 4 men who joined the Knights used the Online Membership option! This tool has become the primary gateway to admission for most men, and for good reason. It's simple, fast, and "open" 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. And it provides applicants with immediate entry- and one full year of free admission!

-Over 87% (128) of Maryland councils are membership-active this year. That means that these councils have successfully welcomed at least one man into the Order. For some, this was incredibly challenging and for others it was simply part of their focus on creating a culture of invitation. In any case, all these councils should be proud of their good work!

-We already have at least 45 councils that have earned the prestigious Star Council Award for membership growth! This reflects favorably on the leadership efforts of so many Grand Knights, Membership Directors, District Deputies, District Wardens, the Membership Growth team and every Knight (and lady) who stepped up and became "fishers of men" in Maryland!

As you can see, these numbers tell an exciting story about the culture of invitation growing within our state jurisdiction. Of course, this story is typically written at the council level, where actions are most impactful and the invitations are extended. Let's continue building on the momentum that you have created and be a force for making a difference in so many lives as we move into the upcoming fraternal year!

On a final note, special thanks to the rock stars on our State Membership team who have worked tirelessly this year on so many occasions to lend a hand. Aid and Support After Pregnancy Program Update

Thanks to all the Councils, Assemblies and individuals that support our Maternity and Pregnancy centers in Maryland. Your support is making a difference.

As you are aware, in the ASAP program, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus will provide a \$100 grant for every \$500 a council or assembly donates in cash or supplies to a non-profit Maternity Home or Pregnancy Center. The request for this grant is through a simple online submission at this website: <https://www.kofc.org/en/contact/asap.html>

Items needed for the online form include:

Organization name and address, Organization EIN number, Donation date, Amount of funds or value of items donated, Evidence of the donation (cancelled check or signed ASAP Donation Letter. The letter is available here: <https://www.kofc.org/en/resources/faith-in-action-programs/life/pregnancy-center-support/11418-9-22-aid-and-support-donation-receipt.pdf>, Grand Knight / Faithful Navigator name member number, Certify that you are not a robot.

A W9 form is required from the organization as evidence that the organization is a non-profit organization. The W9 is not required if the organization is listed on the ASAP website: <https://www.kofc.org/en/what-we-do/faith-in-action-programs/life/aid-support-after-pregnancy.html>. If you do not have a W9, please submit the request anyway. If t is needed, Supreme will contact the Grand Knight / Faithful Navigator listed.

As the Fraternal year winds down, please ensure your ASAP submission to Supreme is submitted for this Fraternal Year by 30 June. The clock starts over at the start of the new Columbian Year.

The Gabriel Network House project in Bowie is complete and the host family has moved in. On 14 June, final touches will be worked with include painting the exterior, replacing the fence that was removed for the construction, and general yard maintenance.

This project can be a source of pride for all Maryland Knights of Columbus members. The project was completed for \$135k, less than half of the estimated \$300k+ if completed by a contractor. MD State Council donated over \$60k for this project with State Deputy Anthony Salvemini securing an ASAP grant of \$10k for this project. In addition, over 2000 man hours were donated for this project.

Grand Knight Patrick Brady from William E. Baldwin, Sr. Council 17990 is the project lead for the Gabriel Network House project. The project started with initial design and permit submission in April 2024. After receiving permits, the Baldwin council started foundation prep in August followed by below grade plumbing, footers, foundation poured. Framing, windows installation, and roof followed. Electric, plumbing and HVAC were completed in November sheetrock installed by the end of the month. The addition was complete in January 2025 and Phase 2 started.

Phase 2 includes a refurbishing of the residences that were originally built over 25 years ago. Phase 2 includes replacing flooring, updating bathrooms, and reconfiguring the living space. GK Brady would like to thank all donors and volunteers including the manpower donated by the Baldwin Council.

The Gabriel Network still needs donations to replenish their funds utilized for this project. Donations to the Gabriel Network are eligible for ASAP grants from Supreme.

“Hagamos una diferencia en la vida de alguien”

Continuamos con la historia de Caballeros de Colón desde su fundación hasta el día de hoy, (vea el bulletin de Julio 2024 donde empezamos esta historia)

2006-2009 EL NUEVO MILENIO

2006: En su primera expansión internacional en casi un siglo, la Orden funda sus primeros consejos en Polonia, comenzando con el Consejo 14000 de Juan Pablo II en Cracovia.

2006: Tras el huracán Katrina en el Golfo de los Estados Unidos, los Caballeros donan más de 10 millones de dólares y 100,000 horas de voluntariado para ayudar a reconstruir las iglesias y escuelas católicas.

2007: La Cúpula de la Encarnación de los Caballeros de Colón, un mosaico de 350 metros cuadrados que representa los misterios de la vida de Cristo, se construye en la Basílica del Santuario Nacional de la Inmaculada Concepción.

2008: El 16 de marzo de 2008, el Papa Benedicto XVI aprueba un decreto de virtud heroica para el Padre Michael J. McGivney, declarándolo “Venerable”.

2008: La Orden está presente durante la visita pastoral del Papa Benedicto XVI a los Estados Unidos. Una placa encargada por los Caballeros de Colón conmemora la misa del Papa en el Yankee Stadium. Acompaña a dos placas similares, que conmemoran las misas que el Papa Juan Pablo II y el Papa Pablo VI celebraron en el mismo lugar.

2008: McGivney Hall, la nueva sede del Pontificio Instituto Juan Pablo II de Estudios sobre Matrimonio y la Familia de la Universidad Católica de América, se consagra el 8 de septiembre.

2009: La Iniciativa de Ecografías de los Caballeros de Colón se lanza el 22 de enero de 2009. Hasta la fecha, se han comprado más de 1000 ecógrafos para centros de maternidad pro-vida usando fondos de contrapartida del Fondo de Cultura de la Vida de la Orden, creado en 2008.

2009: La Orden organiza una cumbre “Vecinos Ayudando a Vecinos” sobre voluntariado en Nueva York y designa el 2009 como el Año del Voluntariado. Se lanza el programa Abrigos para Niños de los Caballeros de Colón; hasta la fecha, la iniciativa ha proporcionado más de 1,000,000 abrigos de invierno a niños de todo Estados Unidos y Canadá.

A Miracle of Faith and Fraternity: The Tanzanian Well Project

Immaculate Conception Council No. 8159 was inspired by the virtues of Mary's Chaplet of Virtues and the dire need for clean water in a village in Tanzania, a community that was struggling from a lack of clean water. Brother Knights rallied together to raise sufficient funds for the purchase and installation of a water well and solar pump to provide clean, safe drinking water to a community in desperate need, thereby improving health and quality of life, especially for children with disabilities, all while strengthening the faith and unity within their council through a shared mission of charity and service. Money was raised through a GoFundMe campaign and an all- you-can-eat crab raffle, a matching gift, other various donations. On Easter Monday 2024, the well was completed and provides a 30-gallon-per-minute refill rate, ensuring a reliable supply of clean water to more than one hundred people in the local community. Inspired by this charity, seventeen men joined the Knights of Columbus, including the council's current Chaplain.

Aid and Support After Pregnancy

St. Louis the King Council No. 11898 challenged itself to embrace Aid and Support After Pregnancy by supporting a minimum of five Life affirming organizations each with a minimum \$2,000 in support. This year, the council exceeded its' goal and supported six different organizations. Five organizations received \$2,000 in monetary contributions, and one organization received over \$2,000 in diapers and other in-kind donations. These six organizations received over \$23,000 in direct aid from the Council.
