

State Chaplain's Message

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While on retreat in July I came across a labyrinth during a walk around the retreat house grounds. If you've never seen a labyrinth, it is usually a walkway, in a circle, that one enters at a certain point, and then follows the laid-out path, through twists and turns, until one reaches the center.

The idea is to pray and reflect as one follows the route, perhaps thinking about one's life journey. For a Christian, one might also reflect on having Christ as the center of our goals and plans, and moving through one's life toward eternal life. Walking a labyrinth, it could seem like life moves in circles, or at times that we are going back to the same place we had started. However, stick to the path, and one will reach the center.

For most of us, the pace of life picks up in September as parish, school, and personal calendars are full once again. The pace picks up in many councils as well, as installations have taken place, and members are back from vacations. At some moments we might feel we are running in circles. Should that be the case, think of the path of the labyrinth, not always straight to our goals. It's a good time to ask if we are taking all the steps to assure success. As with a parish, or a Catholic school, so with a council—there should be spiritual goals for the year, that our various efforts are trying to achieve. Sometimes these are rather clear, such as acts of charity being done because we are Christ's disciples. How about a council social? Building community and fraternity is also a worthy goal. How about a fund-raiser? We need resources to carry out our mission. If the Knights and Ladies aren't becoming better Christians through their efforts then something is missing.

I know some parishes and schools have annual themes, which can be helpful as a focus. Let's remember we have a great one from our Order, "First in Faith, as in Charity," and another from our State Deputy, "Make a Difference in Someone's life; Be a Force for Good." Maybe a personal or council theme is appropriate, such as "Make every day count," "Don't lose sight of the goal," or "Make this a year of blessings." I trust you get the point, and I pray you have a blessed fraternal year.

Did you know that your council is involved in two exciting membership growth incentive program that can translate into big dollar savings? That's correct!

The first one, which is sponsored by the State is called our Fast Start Growth Incentive and here is how it works. Each council has an annual goal of recruiting a certain number of new men into its ranks. If your council achieves its goal by September 30, 2025, then the council will have its State membership per capita fee refunded for the 6-month period January 2026-June 2026! Since a council is charged at an approximate rate of \$4.50 per member, having this fee refunded enables the council to use those funds for any number of other impactful purposes!

The second one is sponsored by Supreme and it's called the "Fishers of Men Incentive, and here is how this works. If a council achieves its membership goal by October 31, then it has the potential to earn hundreds of dollars in funds. However, the MD State Deputy has decided to reward those who accelerate their efforts! If a council achieves its membership goal by September 30, then he will ensure the council earns a minimum of \$250 as part of this Supreme incentive program! Think about it! How about using those funds to support a seminarian, or a pregnancy center, or a council dinner? The possibilities are almost endless- and this can happen when you and your council members reach out and invite men to join the Order! And who doesn't need more Catholic men serving alongside us as we put our faith into action!

By the way, congratulations to Grand Knight Andy Harris of St. John the Evangelist Council 11171 and Grand Knight Tony Bunn of St. Rose of Lima Council 14297 who recently became the first leaders in Maryland to achieve their Fast Start goals! I hope more will follow!

And speaking of recruitment highlights, special congratulations to these brother Knights who are leading the charge with welcoming new men to join us on our great mission:

DD27 Chris Phillips reports that all councils in his district are now membership active!

DD16 John Marley is leading a district that has already welcomed over 15 men into the Order!

St. Rose of Lima Council 14297, with the support of father and son field agents Denis Mayorga Lizano and Denis Mayorga Arauz has welcomed 9 men into their council!

Please continue to offer Catholic men in your communities the gift of Knights of Columbus membership so that our councils will be blessed with the talent, energy and passion needed to make a meaningful difference in so many lives!

And please remember to promote the Online Membership option as the best way to invite a man to join! At least 90% of men joining our councils are doing it through this user-friendly online tool so be sure to become very familiar with it.

Thanks to those of you who continue to inspire your brother Knights. Your efforts are deeply appreciated!

Worthy Grand Knights,

The **Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest** is an excellent opportunity to promote Faith and Family. For a successful program, Councils need planning, publicity and recognition.

September - October, Councils should:

- Designate a chairman
- Order supplies from Officers Online > Supplies Online > Faith in Action > Keep Christ in Christmas. Kits, forms, and publicity posters available.
- Determine your Council's deadline for obtaining poster, judging, recognition of winners and participants, and forwarding to State Chairman by Dec. 23.
- If your budget permits, determine monetary awards (1st place only or 1st, 2nd, 3rd, / amounts, example: 1st \$25-\$50 range, 2nd \$20-\$35 range, 3rd \$15-\$25 range.)
- Start contacting Catholic grade schools and parishes informing them of the program and requesting their participation.
- Discuss with the school or parish: time line for submissions, how and when Council will pickup submissions; how and when Council will announce awards. 


