# State Chaplain's Message

Referring once again to my summer retreat, its theme was St. Francis of Assisi's "Canticle of the Creatures." That well-known poem or hymn was composed by the saint in the year 1225 in Italian (more precisely in the Umbrian dialect of its day) rather than in Latin, and praises Brother Sun and Sister Moon, Brother Wind and Sister Water, and so on. That date, 800 years ago, was just one year before Francis died. While he had only recently received the Stigmata, the wounds of Christ (in late 1224), he was in very poor health, virtually blind, and probably wondering in what direction his Order was going. In that weakened and sad state, but likely with consolation from the Lord, this hymn was composed.

Francis saw the wonder of God's creation in nature, the world and the universe, and all as a reflection of the Creator who, of course, transcends creation. As humans are also God's creation, we should seek to have a reverence for animals, plants, cycles of nature (why St. Francis called them sisters and brothers), and use these resources properly and with respect.

As the feast of St. Francis is observed on October 4th, it can remind us that we praise God through our everyday efforts, at work, at home, and for others. It's also why we Catholics are encouraged to make a morning offering consecrating our efforts, and a prayer at night seeking forgiveness for any offenses of the day and for God's protection.

When we put all of these together, it's also why we make a rosary call to a funeral home, give a warm coat to a child who needs one, pack a Box of Joy, encourage youngsters to express how they "keep Christ in Christmas," collect for the mentally challenged, support new life with sonogram machines and baby supplies for pregnancy centers, "make a difference in someone's life," and so on.

We also celebrate Columbus Day this month, remembering our namesake whose determination and pursuit of a goal opened the eyes of so many to a new world view. Let's never forget Columbus' faith goal, like that of his patron saint, to carry Christ in his message and the Gospel to those who had yet to hear it. Let us, Knights and Ladies, continue to bring Christ to the world.

Our friends at Supreme often provide us with new recruiting tools and they recently shared one that caught my attention. Though I was a bit skeptical at first, I now believe it can be somewhat of a game-changer for our councils.

The new “tool” is called a Membership Enrollment Form. It looks similar to the card that is included in the Delta Church Drive kit but there are some important differences. Essentially, all information that a new member would include on his online application, is requested on the card, including a signature line.

Once the candidate provides the council with his completed card, any council member can then enter that information into the online membership portal and submit. Basically, what you are doing is completing the online application for the candidate.

The candidate will then get a confirmation email from Supreme as part of the normal process. Once he confirms, then the process is complete!

I have been told by various councils around the country that this updated method of recruiting members has been a tremendous success! Councils using the membership enrollment form at their church drives (and events) are seeing large numbers of men joining the Order.



Worthy Grand Knights,

The **Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest** is an excellent opportunity to promote Faith and Family. For a successful program, Councils need planning, publicity and recognition.

September - October, Councils should:

- Designate a chairman
- Order supplies from Officers Online > Supplies Online > Faith in Action > Keep Christ in Christmas. Kits, forms, and publicity posters available.
- Determine your Council's deadline for obtaining poster, judging, recognition of winners and participants, and forwarding to State Chairman by Dec. 23.
- If your budget permits, determine monetary awards (1<sup>st</sup> place only or 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, / amounts, example: 1<sup>st</sup> \$25-\$50 range, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$20-\$35 range, 3<sup>rd</sup> \$15-\$25 range.)
- Start contacting Catholic grade schools and parishes informing them of the program and requesting their participation.
- Discuss with the school or parish: time line for submissions, how and when Council will pickup submissions; how and when Council will announce awards. School example: during morning announcements, at assembly (Christmas concert, Christmas pageant) when parents and others students can see and applaud. Parish example: announcements before or after mass, Sunday coffee and donuts, parish Christmas pageant, breakfast with Santa, Council Christmas party.

November,

- Prepare info for school and parish to put in their announcements and bulletins. Provide school and parish with Keep Christ in Christmas info posters with deadline and Council chairman contact info, along with sufficient Entry Forms (form #5025), a PDF of the Entry Form can also be emailed to school/parish to be included with their email announcements. **Note, poster size limit of 12 x 14** (so that State winners can be sent to Supreme in a standard USPS package).

December,

- Collect and judge posters.

- Announce and present winners. Publicize winners on Council social media, website and newsletter, send brief summary of program and winners to parish for submission into bulletin. Note, posters can be returned to families. However, First place winning posters that are sent to State, will be returned at the Mid-Term meeting. Only the State First Place winning posters that will be sent to Supreme will not be returned.
- Send 1<sup>st</sup> Place winning posters to State Keep Christ in Christmas chairman by December 23. Posters can be:
  - mailed to State Chairman Tim Fitzmaurice: 1593 Crofton Parkway, Crofton, MD 21114.

January,

- State winners announced at Mid-Term Meeting on Saturday, January 10. With exception of State First placed winners, that will be sent to Supreme for the international judging, posters will be available for pick-up. If a Council representative is not present at Mid-Term, District Deputy can pick up.


