Pope Leo XIV recently issued his first Apostolic Exhortation on October 4th, the feast of St. Francis. No doubt that date was chosen because it is a letter that was started by Pope Francis before his death, and then concluded and made his own by Pope Leo. The title of the letter, *Dilexi te*, translates “I have loved you” (Revelation 3.9), and the letter speaks of the Lord’s love for His people, and in a particular way for the poor.

Jesus came into the world poor, lived the life of a poor man, and He repeatedly paid particular attention to the needs of the poor. Having this identity with the poor, when Jesus promised “I am always with you,” one of the ways is in the presence of the poor. Service to the poor, and support of their needs, is a way that the disciple gives back to the Lord.

It strikes me that this call from Popes Francis and Leo goes particularly to the Knights of Columbus. It was the very often desperate situation of the immigrant that led to the founding of the Knights, who have “charity” as their first principle. Go through the list of ways the Knights offer support to those in need: when tragedy strikes a location, when a child needs a coat, when a Box of Joy will make a difference, when food is collected for the ministry of the Little Sisters of the Poor, when there is aid and support after pregnancy, when tuition support helps young people to attend Catholic school, and vocations be nourished in seminaries and houses of formation, when tootsie rolls are a means to collect for those challenged—and the list could go on.

Knights and Ladies so regularly join in the charitable works of the Church, and one might say the more that happens, the more the Knights and Ladies will be blessed—as an organization and as individuals. It is the message one hears repeatedly from those who give of their time and talent in service, interacting directly with those in need. Service can sometimes seem intimidating at first, but almost always comes to be seen as a blessing to the one who serves.

This month, as we celebrate Thanksgiving, we realize we have so much for which we can express our gratitude. It’s a holiday that also reminds us of the thanksgiving we celebrate when we gather around the altar of the Lord. I hope it helps to inspire an “attitude of gratitude” in each of us. We have so many reasons to say, “thanks be to God.” May the realization of our blessings inspire us to charity for others. May you and your loved ones have a blessed and happy Thanksgiving!

Councils have been busy this fall collecting donations to support our neighbors with special needs, delivering winter coats to children to keep warm this winter, coordinating and promoting novenas for life, planning holy hours, and collecting food for families. All council program directors should share information about the many FIA programs available at all council meetings and in conversations with all members with a special invitation to new members. FIA programs are easy ways that each of us can make a difference in our homes, parishes, and communities. Does your council need help with some ideas? Supreme has announced five new FIA programs (Faith: Imitating Saint Juan Diego; Family: Remembering Our Faithful Departed; Community: Bright Futures and Celebrating our Catholic Heritage; and Life: Holy Hour for Life with Our Lady of Guadalupe) with three more to be announced later this year. Remember to submit Faith in Action Program Report Form 10784 to Supreme as soon as you complete your program or activity. Over 2,400 FIA programs have already been reported to Supreme from March 1st through September 30th.

Over one hundred councils participated, raising over \$125,000 with \$50,000 staying with the councils and over \$70,000 supporting the State Council Charity and Scholarship Programs). Thank you for supporting this critical fundraiser. Widows Program

What is your Council doing to help its widows?

Does your Council have a Widows Program? Do you invite your widows to Council and State Events? Have they been invited to the State Memorial Mass on Nov. 9 at the Shrine of St. Anthony in Ellicott City?

It is our duty and privilege as Knights to assist our widows. Many Councils have programs in place to make a widow of a fallen Knight continue to be a vital part of their Council programs and activities. A guide to help Councils either begin a Widows Program or augment an existing one is available on the Faith in Action, Family Director's page at the Maryland State Council website: <https://kofc-md.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/10/2025-MD-State-Council-Widows-Program-Guide-.pdf>.

The guide offers simple, zero cost and low-cost ideas to remember our widows and keep them engaged in Council and State activities. Be sure to include a Widows Program line item in your next Council budget.

Make a concerted effort throughout the year to keep your widows involved at your Council, not just by inviting them to your annual Memorial Mass. Periodic dinners, birthday and holiday cards, and other simple gestures are easy ways to make a widow feel appreciated and active at your Council. Create and maintain a database to stay in regular contact with your widows.

Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) Program



Pro-life pregnancy centers exist to provide abortion-vulnerable pregnant women with options and help them choose life for themselves and their unborn children. Though pregnancy centers usually offer their services for free to pregnant women, most pregnancy centers accept few, if any, government funds. They rely on private support to keep operating and meet the needs of the women that come to them for help. Pregnancy centers have a need for financial contributions, but also have a need for volunteer hours, specialized labor, and material goods/services/resources. They also have a need for prayer support.

The Knights of Columbus Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) program is designed to assist with the financial aspect. The ASAP program is a simple one – for every \$500 in cash or goods a council donates to a qualified pregnancy center or maternity center, Supreme will provide a \$100 grant (maximum \$400 grant for \$2000 or more donation). The request for the process is quite simple – all that is needed for most donations is either a copy of the processed check or a signed donation form. In some cases, an IRS W-4 is needed to confirm the center is a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization.

In the 2024-2025 fraternal year, Maryland Councils performed well supporting Pregnancy Centers, anchored by State Deputy Anthony Salvamini's initiative of the Gabriel House Project in Bowie. Maryland had 37 ASAP applications (rank #21 in the order) with a total donation amount of \$138,473 (rank #10 in the order). The Gabriel Project was led by Past Grand Knight Patrick Brady and the William E. Baldwin, Sr., Council #17990.

Examples of activities that can qualify for the ASAP grants from Supreme include Direct Donations, Baby Bottle Drives, fundraisers, open houses, etc. Material assistance includes donations of baby items (equipment, food, formula, diapers, wipes), clothes (maternity, baby, infant, and toddler) and other items often listed on the pregnancy center's or Maternity home's website.

Although volunteer hours do not qualify for ASAP grants, volunteers are needed by these centers. Many of the centers also hold fundraisers and appreciation dinners at which councils are encouraged to participate.

Let's keep up the support of our Pregnancy and Maternity Centers – bring our councils, assemblies, chapters, and Parishes into this life saving program.

Worthy Grand Knights,

The **Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest** is an excellent opportunity to promote Faith and Family. For a successful program, Councils need planning, publicity and recognition.

September - October, Councils should:

- Designate a chairman
- Order supplies from Officers Online > Supplies Online > Faith in Action > Keep Christ in Christmas. Kits, forms, and publicity posters available.
- Determine your Council's deadline for obtaining poster, judging, recognition of winners and participants, and forwarding to State Chairman by Dec. 23.
- If your budget permits, determine monetary awards (1st place only or 1st, 2nd, 3rd, / amounts, example: 1st \$25-\$50 range, 2nd \$20-\$35 range, 3rd \$15-\$25 range.)
- Start contacting Catholic grade schools and parishes informing them of the program and requesting their participation.
- Discuss with the school or parish: time line for submissions, how and when Council will pickup submissions; how and when Council will announce awards. School example: during morning announcements, at assembly (Christmas concert, Christmas pageant) when parents and others students can see and applaud. Parish example: announcements before or after mass, Sunday coffee and donuts, parish Christmas pageant, breakfast with Santa, Council Christmas party.

November,

- Prepare info for school and parish to put in their announcements and bulletins. Provide school and parish with Keep Christ in Christmas info posters with deadline and Council chairman contact info, along with sufficient Entry Forms (form #5025), a PDF of the Entry Form can also be emailed to school/parish to be included with their email announcements. **Note, poster size limit of 12 x 14** (so that State winners can be sent to Supreme in a standard USPS package).

December,

- Collect and judge posters.

- Announce and present winners. Publicize winners on Council social media, website and newsletter, send brief summary of program and winners to parish for submission into bulletin. Note, posters can be returned to families. However, First place winning posters that are sent to State, will be returned at the Mid-Term meeting. Only the State First Place winning posters that will be sent to Supreme will not be returned.
- Send 1st Place winning posters to State Keep Christ in Christmas chairman by December 23. Posters can be:
 - mailed to State Chairman Tim Fitzmaurice: 1593 Crofton Parkway, Crofton, MD 21114.

January,

- State winners announced at Mid-Term Meeting on Saturday, January 10. With exception of State First placed winners, that will be sent to Supreme for the international judging, posters will be available for pick-up. If a Council representative is not present at Mid-Term, District Deputy can pick up.
